### ARTICLE 9 C-1 DISTRICTS

**15.241** Sec. 109.1 **USES.** 

- In a C-1 District no building or premises shall be used and no building shall be erected, enlarged or altered except for one or more of the following specified purposes.
- 2. One and one-half (1-1/2) story dwellings, and those having greater heights, shall have a minimum ground floor area of six hundred seventy two (672) square feet.
- D. **FRONT YARDS.** There shall be a front yard on every lot. The minimum depth of any front yard shall be twenty-five (25) feet except for the following provisions:
- 1. Any dwelling hereafter erected along a block-front shall be provided with a front yard at least equal to the average of the front yards of the existing dwellings.
- 2. No new dwelling shall project into the required front yard area more than one-third (1/3) of the distance separating the nearest dwelling on an abutting lot.
- 3. In no case shall the above provisions be construed to require a front yard depth greater than thirty-five (35) feet.

## E. SIDE YARDS.

- 1. There shall be for every building a side yard along each lot line of a minimum width of five (5) feet and the total width of both side yards shall be at least ten (10) feet.
- 2. The width of a side yard abutting upon a street shall be not less than the minimum front yard required in this district.
- 3. Where lots with less than fifty-five (55) foot width are involved in new construction the Board of Appeals will determine in each case the required minimum side yard abutting upon a street to conform as near as possible to existing dwellings. The Board of Appeals determination will, in some cases, include the combining of two or more lots to provide conformity to existing dwellings.
- F. **REAR YARDS.** There will be a rear yard on every lot, the minimum depth of which shall be thirty (30) feet; provided however, a private garage may be constructed within five (5) feet of said rear lot line, except where a rear yard abuts on an alley a private garage shall be constructed at least ten (10) feet from the alley.

#### B. ACCESSORY USES AND BUILDINGS.

- 1. All accessory uses permitted in R-3 Districts.
- 2. The incidental manufacture, processing or storage of goods for sale, except the killing or dressing of animals or fowl.

#### **15.242** Sec. 109.2 **HEIGHTS AND AREAS.**

A. **HEIGHTS.** No building or structure shall exceed three (3) stories in height.

## B. AREAS.

- **1. Minimum lot area.** No minimum lot area required.
- 2. All dwellings built in C-1 Districts shall have a minimum ground floor area as required in R-3 Districts.
- 3. All buildings other than dwellings shall have no minimum ground floor requirements.
- C. FRONT YARDS. The minimum depth of any front yard shall be thirty (30) feet.

## D. SIDE YARDS.

- 1. The width of side yards for a dwelling shall be as required in R-3 Districts.
- 2. Side yards for buildings other than dwellings shall not be required.

#### E. REAR YARDS.

- 1. The depth of a rear yard for a dwelling shall be as required in R-3 Districts.
- 2. Rear yards for buildings other than dwellings shall not be required.
- **F. OFF-STREET PARKING AND LOADING REQUIREMENTS.** In addition to the minimum yard areas herein mentioned for this district, there shall also be required an off- street parking area for the loading and unloading and the parking of vehicles off of all public streets and highways in accordance with the following minimum schedule.

- **1.** All uses permitted in R-3 Districts that are allowed in this district. Same number of parking spaces as required in R-3 Districts.
- **2.** Bowling alleys, restaurants, taverns, etc. 200% of the floor area.
- 3. Retail stores, supermarkets, etc. 150% of the floor area.
- **4.** Theaters, Auditoriums (other than school auditoriums), skating rinks, etc. 1 parking space for every six seats or six patrons.
- **5.** All other business or uses. 50% of the floor area.
